Charlotte is finishing up this wonderful tree skirt as a wedding gift for a young couple in her family.



Play on Words Quilt Challenge



Bring your entry to the 2015 Play on Words Quilt Challenge in a pillowcase without your name on the quilt or the pillowcase. Julie T and Laurie P-D will hang all of the entries, which are identified by a number/letter. During break, all guild members view the quilts and vote using a written ballot on the best small wall hanging, best large wall hanging, best in the Miscellaneous category, and best in show. As the votes are being counted, we all guess who made each quilt. Then the winners are announced and ribbons awarded. See page 7 for guidelines.

Opportunity Quilt: We draw one name from the Opportunity Quilt tickets sold and announce the winner. Karen W will be awarding a prize to the individual who sold the most tickets. Please bring all remaining tickets to the December meeting.

Just Finish It: In addition, we end this past year's Just Finish It and award a prize to the person who completed the most items on his or her list. We hand out new "Just Finish it" lists for 2016. You select the 12 UFO's (Unfinished Objects) you most want to complete in 2016, list them on your form, and turn your form into me. Each time you bring a finished UFO from your list to show us, you get to select a fat quarter and check that UFO off your list.

Major Workshops

All of our Spring major workshops (Garber and Hargrave) are filled. Paula is keeping a waiting list for Garber's and I am keeping waiting lists for Hargrave's. Just give us your contact information and if someone must drop out, we will give them your contact information. We also need folks to sew nametags.

Finally, we have been given about 15-20 old quilts in various conditions. We plan to try to sell some in our boutique at the quilt show. We also plan to cut up several of the quilts and one quilt top and make table runners and stuffed elephants to sell at the boutique. At the work meeting, we will have some folks cutting and preparing the table runners and elephants, others sewing, and still others stuffing and finishing the elephants.

It's time to reveal your ... 2015 Challenge: "Play on Words"

Rules

Limited to two entries per person. Entries must be in different categories and must be brought to the December 12th meeting.

Entry must depict a play on words. We encourage playful, fun-filled, pun-filled entries, but serious depictions are also valued. The entry can be any style (traditional, contemporary, or modern or a combination). Lettering and embellishments are encouraged, but not required.

The title or theme of the quilt must reflect a play on words and be visible. It can be part of the quilt design or you can write the title on paper and pin it to the quilt for the December meeting.

The quilt should be in a pillowcase that is labeled with the category you are entering. You should drop it off in the lobby when you arrive in December.

Item must be made with two or more layers of fabric held together with quilt stitching throughout.

Item must meet requirements and be entered in one of the following categories:

Larger wall hanging: each of the four sides must be at least 30 inches and no longer than 60 inches.

Smaller wall hanging: Each of the four side must be less than 30 inches.

Miscellaneous: This includes wearables, household items, 3-D sculptures. Item cannot be larger than 40 inches in any dimension.

Prize ribbons will be awarded based on the votes of members present at our December 12th meeting. We will have 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place ribbons in each category and a Best of Show ribbon.

The most important rule is: Have fun with this Challenge!





Two Hot Topics

After receiving feedback from members, I want to return to two of the three contentious topics for quilters:

- 1. Press your seams open or to the side? There is no debate in our guild. Everyone agreed it is better to press seam allowances to the side. Most folks said it is much easier to nest or butt the seams against each other while piecing to get perfectly aligned seams.
- 2. Prewash or not? Most folks who prewash do so to prevent fabrics from bleeding, especially reds, purples, dark greens, and dark blues. Some of us prewash to prevent shrinkage. As for bleeding, prewashing does not always prevent bleeding. I had some dark turquoise fabric bleed after it had been prewashed. So, I did some research (Hargrave, 1997, *From Fiber to Fabric* and Hargrave & Craig, 2000, *The Art of Classic Quiltmaking)*.
- 1. Some fabrics will not bleed in cold water (80-85 degrees) but if the water is warmer than 85 degrees, they will bleed.
- 2. Bleeding is sometimes due to the levels of chlorine in your tap water. If you have this problem, you can neutralize the chlorine with products from swimming pool, spa, and fish tank stores.
- Some fabrics bleed due to the detergent you use to wash the quilt (even the gentle detergents typically used to wash quilts).
- 4. Some fabrics bleed but the dye does not migrate onto other fabrics.
- 5. Sometimes when two fabrics are wet and contacting each other, the darker fabric can stain the lighter one—even when this fabric has not shown any indication of bleeding due to water temperature, detergent, or chlorine.

All texts I read recommended testing small pieces of your fabric in cold and hot tap water and if fabrics bleed then test in distilled water to determine if chlorine caused the bleeding. You also should test fabrics in water with the detergent you intend to use. Then, you will know what to expect from the fabrics.
